

Resolution for St. Paul's Episcopal Church to Remain in the Anglican Communion

Explanation:

The 75th General Convention of the Episcopal Church has failed in accepting unreservedly the Windsor Report, and has failed to commit to a Church life consonant with the Windsor Report, and as a result of this non-compliance to the Windsor Report, ECUSA may have jeopardized its status as a member of the Anglican Communion. The Constitution of the Episcopal Church in the United States of America states its aim to be full members of the Anglican Communion.

BE IT RESOLVED that we, the Members, Vestry, Delegates and Clergy of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, in the Episcopal Diocese of Eau Claire, do disassociate ourselves from those actions of the 74th General Convention that have "breached the bonds of affection" between us and the worldwide Anglican Communion, and those actions of the 75th General Convention of the Episcopal Church in the United States of America that do not fully comply with the Windsor Report; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we repudiate these actions and hereby do repent before God of them; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we, the Members, Vestry, Delegates and Clergy of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, through our will to comply fully with the Windsor Report, declare that it is our aim and desire to remain in full membership and communion with the Anglican Communion worldwide, standing with all Anglican Churches, Dioceses, and Provinces that hold and maintain the "Historic Faith, Doctrine, Sacrament and Discipline of the One Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church," and who hold and maintain the Authority of Holy Scripture, whatever the costs or actions required to do so.
